











Wheels Festival puts Bournemouth in pole position

Bournemouth's third high energy Wheels Festival attracted an estimated 410,000 people over three action-packed days, featuring thrilling stunt shows, gleaming supercar parades and monster action on the resort's golden sands.

The free family event, which is the biggest of its kind in the UK, brings in more than £15m turnover and, in its third year, has established itself as a high profile addition to Bournemouth's entertainment calendar. Wheels is now a credible sister event to the internationally-renowned and award-winning Air Festival and is growing at the same rate.



As well as attracting visitors from further afield to the UK's premier destination, the event benefits locals with around 60% of festival-goers coming from Bournemouth and the surrounding area. The remaining 40% lie within a 2-3 hour drive time. And provide a major early season boost to the visitor economy.



Since its inception in 2014, the festival's reputation has grown to the extent that it now draws in high profile and nationally celebrated participants including prominent female racing driver, Lorina Mclaughlin, TV stunt star, Paul Swift, and touring car champion, Tom Chilton. This year, for the first time, Wheels also welcomed the 2016 BXUK British Beachcross Championships—a beachcross motorcycle and quad bike race series that attracts competitive riders from across Europe.

Traders and exhibitors reported a busy weekend on site and the festival now sees global brand sponsors returning to take advantage of the exposure offered through the unrivalled footfall along Bournemouth's seafront. In particular, Jeep recorded a very successful second year and have asked to return in 2017 with an even bigger and better experiential offer.

Also keen to retain their title as Festival Partner in 2017, Bournemouth's Coastal BID came on board for the third year in a row and gave significant financial support to the main festival as well as Wheels in Soutbourne. The event also attracted the Town Centre BID in an official capacity for the first time, enabling activity to



spread further into the town than ever before—with pre-war and vintage cars on display in the town centre and the big wheel at the triangle proving to be popular attractions.



Seeing the town centre realise the benefits of such a major event, Bournemouth's coastal villages have been keen to get a bigger slice of the action and Wheels returned to Southbourne for a second year, with help from Southbourne-on-Sea Business Association. Scores of locals flocked to Southbourne Grove, securing its position as the largest community event in the town's calendar—with views to the event's web page up 25% on last year.

In just three fast and furious years, Wheels has made its mark as another signature event for Bournemouth, capable of bringing millions of pounds to the economy.





Combining the unique appeal of a magnificent bay with a vast programme of attractions and high quality entertainment, these festivals are undoubtedly raising the profile of the resort in line with its vision to become an 'eventful' world class destination.

Local residents and visitors to Bournemouth Wheels Festival enjoyed sunny spells and mild temperatures across three days of non-stop displays and demonstrations. Highlights included British racing driver Tom Chilton and TV stunt star Paul Swift on the Demo Straight, monster trucks in the Coastal BID Arena with the addition of Aussie daredevil, the Kangaroo Kid, and a Wheels debut for the BXUK Championships. Saturday and Sunday saw a brand

new pop-up arena show from the Two Brothers Motorcycle Stunt Team.

Heading up the historic F1 cars was female racing driver dubbed the "Surrey Speed Queen", Lorina McLaughlin who, along with her ex-Michael Schumacher Benetton B192, has been a major part of the festival since its inception. At the front of the supercar pack — a parade of vehicles worth over £16 million - was British racing legend, Tom Chilton in his Nissan Skyline GTR. A shining star in his field, Tom was also on hand to chat to fans in the supercar display marquee at the Waterfront in Pier

Approach.



Meanwhile, in the Coastal BID Arena, hundreds of families were entertained by monster trucks Big Pete, Grim Reaper, Slingshot and Swamp Thing as they raced side-by-side, bouncing and rolling over scrap cars. There were also combined shows with the Kangaroo Kid, Matt Coulter, as he tackled death-defying jumps over the sand.







At Boscombe Pier, there were the beach cross championships, military vehicles, car clubs on the prom and Sporting Bears who offered classic and supercar rides in return for charity donations. At Bournemouth Pier, festival-goers enjoyed funfair rides, displays at the interactive Jeep Beach Arena and took the opportunity to talk to local dealerships about the latest models from some of the biggest car brands at Motor Show in Motion. Children and adults alike also watched

the BMX riders and in-line skaters from Team Extreme, as well as motorcycle trials from the Xtreme Stunt Team.


